



*Hualalai*




*The day's light settles, the wind whispers, and

*Prepare for the voyage of your life.*



these delights.












*Hualalai is graced with natural lava tubes and spring-fed ponds, such as the two-acre Waia'auhi. The Hawaiians managed these resources in efficient systems of aquaculture that fed the villagers and provided habitat for wetland birds. Today, the modern stewards of Hualalai cherish and maintain these traditions.*








*Beauty above, challenge below.*

worked his magic.*







*At the fifth hole of Ke'olu, an extraordinary water feature appears. Much more than a pond,*

nutritional consultation pave the way to wellness.*






*Take a plunge outdoors or a lomi lomi

relaxing.*








*Luxury and privacy are the hallmarks of Hualalai, where
